

Here's How...

Although Sniffy reminds you to "Smell Gas? Act FAST!," there are actually THREE ways to detect a gas leak (smell is the most common):

- **SMELL** To help you SMELL a leak, gas companies add a chemical that smells like rotten eggs.
- SEE Near a leaking gas pipeline, you might SEE blowing dirt, water with bubbles in it or an area of dead plants surrounded by live ones.
- HEAR A leaking pipeline, appliance or propane storage tank or cylinder might make a hissing sound you can HEAR.

If you AVER smell, see or hear a gas leak

- 1 Tell a grown-up right away!
- Leave the area quickly and don't touch or use anything electric on your way out—not even a light switch or telephone.
 - Don't return until the gas company says it's safe.
